# Introduction to asbestos



Since 1983, asbestos has been completely banned in more than 39 countries around the world. In Canada, the use of asbestos has decreased considerably since the end of the 1970s. Its bans are mainly aimed at stopping health problems and complications from the use of asbestos.

In order to work safely, it is important to know the risks and the effects of exposure to asbestos. In addition, the worker must know the compulsory procedures and the related proper protective measures.
